As an advisory committee of Council, the Audit Committee is independent of management and does not have any executive powers, delegated responsibility or authority to implement actions over which management has responsibility. The committee liaises closely with management and Council's internal and external auditors to carry out its responsibilities in accordance with the Audit Committee Policy and Charter.

Responsibilities:

The Audit Committee's main responsibilities are to provide assurance that:

- the credibility and objectivity of internal and external financial reporting is enhanced;
- corporate governance responsibilities are addressed;
- internal control frameworks are appropriate;
- laws and regulations are complied with;
- best practice guidelines are implemented where cost-effective and possible;
- key business risks and opportunities are effectively managed;
- business systems and processes operate efficiently and effectively;
- the audit process (both internal and external) is effective; and
- the external reporting is effective.

The Committee will:

- Support measures to improve management performance and business systems and controls;
- Promote the need for public accountability to ratepayers and the community;
- Promote effective liaison between senior management, Internal Auditors and External Auditors;
- Oversee and appraise the quality of the audits conducted both by the Council's Internal and External Auditors; and
- Provide recommendations to Council via written report as soon as possible after reviews are completed.
